

MICHAEL VIGER

Fine art Painter



From the camera to the paintbrush, Michaël Viger traces an artistic journey as unique as it is daring. The son of a French film score composer and an Austrian mother, interior decorator, he was immersed from a young age in a world where art transcends boundaries.

Trained at the Beaux-Arts, he surprised everyone by diving into the world of cinema.

For 35 years, he roamed the sets, from documentaries to feature films, from "The Man in the Iron Mask" to "The Visitors," honing his eye as a director.

But fate had other plans. A chance encounter with wooden formwork panels reignited his passion for painting. From that moment, Michaël reinvented his art, blending his cinematic experience with an innovative technique.


Today, his works travel from Vienna to Rome and Madrid, bearing witness to a talent that transforms the everyday into scenes worthy of the big screen.

ARTISTIC INSPIRATION

Michaël Viger's art is a visual symphony where jazz meets Fellini, and raw wood converses with oil. Each painting is a frozen film, capturing the essence of a moment, an emotion.

His inspiration? It springs from the bustling streets of New York, the smoky jazz clubs of Paris, and the film sets. He paints like a director frames a shot: each brushstroke is a long take, and each texture is a focus on the human soul.

He inspired from **Hopper's** daily poetry, from **Klimt** the elegant sensualtity and from cinema the art of the story telling with a single glance. But it is on formwork wood, an unlikely yet evocative medium, that he finds his one voice. Michaël doesn't simply paint scenes; he creates worlds where the viewer is invited to travel, to dream, to feel. Each piece is an invitation to a sensory journey, an immersive experience where the ordinary becomes extraordinary.

STYLE AND INFLUENCES: THE ARTISTIC DNA OF MICHAËL VIGER

SIGNATURE STYLE

- Unique Fusion: A marriage between technical fine Arts and cinematic storytelling





THE ARTWORK: A DAILY VISUAL SYMPHONY

Jazz Scenes: Musical Vibrations Captured on Wood

Jazz clubs come to life under the artist's brush. Each painting resonates with the silent notes of the saxophone and piano, capturing the smoky atmosphere and palpable energy of Parisian nights. The artist translates the rhythm and improvisation of jazz into dynamic brushstrokes and striking plays of light.



Atmosphere: Light and Emotion

Cinema: Framing and Visual Storytelling



THE EARLY WALKING MAN

2022 250CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

"The Early Walking Man" is a vibrant tribute to Charlie Parker, nicknamed "Bird." This colorful and dynamic work depicts a graffiti-covered wall, symbolizing Parker's effervescent creativity and enduring legacy.

Michaël uses his oil-on-wood technique to recreate the texture and energy of street art, incorporating visual elements that evoke Parker's life and music. The painting captures the spirit of bebop and the complex personality of the artist, blending references to his musical brilliance and personal struggles.

This piece illustrates the artist's ability to merge different artistic styles to create a powerful visual narrative.







CIAO BELLO

2023 150CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

"Ciao Bello" pays tribute to Federico Fellini, 30 years after his passing. On the wooden stage, an elegant male figure is depicted, arms raised in a theatrical gesture, evoking the dynamism of Fellini's cinema—grandiose, bold, slightly absurd.

Colors dance on the rough texture of the surface, creating a visual ballet where the bright white of the suit stands out against a background of warm and deep tones. It's a play of light worthy of the director's finest shots, where every shade tells a story.

The title "Ciao Bello," both a greeting and a farewell, reflects Fellini's enduring legacy.

The artist, drawing on his own years behind the camera, transforms the canvas into a movie screen. Every brushstroke is a sequence shot, every texture an emotional tracking shot.

This piece is more than a painting; it's Fellini brought to life, for a moment, in a whirlwind of creativity and pictorial audacity.


BORN TO BE BLUES

2023 150CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

"Born to be Blues" pays tribute to the legendary jazz trumpeter Chet Baker. This striking piece captures an intimate moment from Baker's tumultuous life, depicting him seated, deep in thought, as he writes.

Michaël uses his signature technique of oil on wood to create a dark and melancholic atmosphere, evoking the complexity of Baker's life. The painting references the episode when Baker, incarcerated in Italy in 1962, composed one of his rare songs, *"Chetty's Lullaby."*

The artist skillfully blends biographical and symbolic elements, such as photographs and the trumpet in the background, to narrate the story of a musician truly *"born to the blues."* This work showcases the visual storyteller's ability to merge his love of jazz and cinema within his paintings, creating a poignant portrait of a troubled artist.



AROUND MIDNIGHT

2022 60CM X 250CM OIL ON WOOD "Around Midnight" immerses the viewer in the enchanting atmosphere of a New York jazz club. The artist captures the nighttime scene's essence, where the legendary voice of Billie Holiday resonates. The painting evokes turbulent's essence life of Lady Day, blending the beauty of her music with the tragedy of her existence.

Through his oil-on-wood technique, the painter creates a dark and intimate ambiance, reflecting the artist's personal struggles and the magic of her voice.

"Around Midnight" invites us to close our eyes, listen with our hearts, and be carried away by the mesmerizing rhythm of a bygone yet eternal era. This work merges the artist's love for jazz with his mastery of visual storytelling, offering a poignant tribute to a musical icon.





SHE WAS 18 / HE WAS 20

2023 (DIPTYCH) 150CM X 60CM (EACH PANEL) OIL ON WOOD

This poignant diptych captures Daniel Warner Martin and Mary Farquarson's tragic story of D, intertwined with the fate of the Titanic. The artist employs his signature technique of oil on wood to create two contrasting yet connected scenes. The first panel depicts a young man in evening attire, symbolizing Daniel, standing near a Titanic lifebuoy. The second panel portrays a radiant young woman, evoking Mary, on the ship's deck. The vivid colors and deep shadows create an atmosphere that is both glamorous and melancholic.

The artwork illustrates the pivotal moment when the couple, married for only a few months, is torn apart by tragedy. Daniel's words, *"It's alright little girl. You go. I stay,"* resonate within the composition, capturing their youth and his ultimate sacrifice.

Michaël blends his cinematic experience with his painterly sensitivity to tell a story of love and fate, transforming a historical moment into a moving and timeless work of art.




SHE'S LOOKING FOR

CALLE GIANNI

2023 150CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

"Calle Gianni" immerses us in Federico Fellini's enchanting universe. A stylish and mysterious male silhouette stands out against a scarlet background, like a ghost from the streets of Rome. The oil gently caresses the raw wood, creating a texture that evokes vintage posters and timeworn film sets. Each brushstroke is a cult replica, each hue an iconic scene.

Mastroianni, Connery, Ford—their shadows dance in the folds of the white suit, recalling the legendary collaborations that shaped the golden age of Italian cinema. The artist, drawing from his years behind the camera, translates the magic of the big screen onto wood.

It's a visual symphony where cinema and painting dance a passionate tango, inviting the viewer to get lost in a labyrinth of cinematic memories and pictorial emotions.



A TIME FOR REFLEXION

2023 60CM X 250CM OIL ON WOOD Venice, 1970. She knew that it would be her last glass before a long time. Sascha just left hearing the steps of the police in staircase.

Laura was a spy, working for the KGB, she had too. It wasn't becazuse she loved her country, it was because she wanted to change things. She almost succeed? Her last mission was to give the name of the mole working for the Americans to Sascha. The mole was just working for money and gave the list of agents being in Europe. SHE WANT'S TO WIN

2023 70CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

With a bold stroke of the brush, we find ourselves in prewar London, where jazz vibrates through the walls. At the heart of the canvas stands a singer, determined to conquer her audience. Behind her, an explosion of graffitishouts modernity. It's a clash of cultures: jazz and street art ahead of their time. Michaël plays with contrasts, blending the amber tones of the club with the freshness of urban tags.

This artwork tells the story of women daring to dream big in a man's world. "She Wants to Win" is more than just a title; it's a rallying cry. A visual ode to determination, where the roughness of the wood embraces the fluidity of the oil.



MEN AT LUNCH

2022 60CM X 250CM OIL ON WOOD Lunch atop a Skyscraper is a black-and-white photograph taken on September 20, 1932, of eleven ironworkers sitting on a steel beam of the RCA Building, 850 feet (260 meters) above the ground during the construction of Rockefeller Center in Manhattan, New York City. It was in fact a promotion picture made from Charles C. Ebbets. Those men were used to move and to work without any protections and security. They came from Irland, Poland, Germany and were ready to risk their life just to work in this open and new country. What did change today?



CANNES 1952


2023 150CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

At the heart of the painting, a young and carefree Roger Vadim savors the moment. The artist captures the effervescence of the Cannes Film Festival with a warm palette of greens and browns. One can almost hear the rustle of evening gowns.

Yet, this is not just a frozen scene. It's the story of a budding romance, that of Vadim for Brigitte Bardot, subtly woven into the fabric of the composition. Two years of waiting, of restrained desire, crystallized in a gaze.

"Cannes 1952" is more than a painting; it's a time capsule. It transports us to the dawn of the New Wave, when French cinema was poised to conquer the world.

A moment of pure happiness, captured on wood like a dream.



HEAR MY LAUGHT

2024 60CM X 150CM OIL ON WOOD

She was very happy for once to met a friend. As the youngest daughter of the president, in an African country. She wasn't allowed to do a lot. And to go out, even less. In fact she had a very painful experience a few month ago. She falls in love with Jimmy who was in fact a spy. She gave him to much access in her life and to secret informations about her father.

EARTHA KITT "C'EST SI BON"

2020 150CM X 60CM OIL ON WOOD

A Silver's flash in the night, and suddenly, Eartha Kitt emerges from the darkness. Her voice, one can imagine, suave and powerful, vibrates the air around her. The artist captures the very essence of the jazz diva. In her white gown, Kitt is an apparition, part woman, part spirit. The striking contrast between the deep black and the touches of light creates a palpable tension, as if the singer is emerging from the shadows to enchant us.

"C'est si bon," whispers the title, and we feel it. Each brushstroke is a note of music, each nuance of gray a modulation of her legendary voice. Realism intertwines with the fantastic, creating a work that transcends the mere portrait.

This is not just a painting; it's a sensory experience. One almost believes they can hear the rustling of her dress, feel the electricity of her presence. A moment of magic, frozen on wood, capturing the soul of jazz and the timeless charisma of Eartha Kitt.




